Re: Oliver St. Area Sanitary Sewer Improvements

Dear Owners/Residents:

The Northwestern Water & Sewer District ("District") is performing repairs on the sanitary sewer system in your area. This project is part of an on-going effort by the District to eliminate excessive infiltration and storm water inflow into the sanitary sewer system which is a cause of excessive loading to the treatment facilities, pumping costs and sanitary sewer overflows into receiving waterways.

One method of construction for this project will be a "no dig" technology. This will have little to no impact on you. A liner will be pulled into the existing sanitary sewer pipe and during the curing process of the pipe liner some residents may experience a slight odor or plastic smell. This is not harmful and will rapidly dissipate.

The second method of construction will be an "open cut" excavation. This portion of the project is required because of the extremely poor condition of one section of the existing sanitary sewer pipe. The existing sanitary sewer main is located in the pavement and will require, at a minimum, one lane of traffic to be closed during the time of installation.

The contractor, Advanced Rehabilitation Technology (ART), will be performing the work on behalf of the District. Construction is anticipated to start late 2016 for the "no dig" portion and the spring of 2017 for the "open cut" portion.
