Re: Perrysburg Area Sanitary Sewer Improvements

Dear Residents/Owners:

The Northwestern Water & Sewer District ("District") is performing repairs to the sanitary sewer system in your area. This project is part of an on-going effort by the District to eliminate excessive infiltration and storm water inflow into the sanitary sewer system which is a cause of excessive loading to the treatment facilities, pumping costs, sanitary sewer overflows into receiving waterways and basement flooding.

The method of construction is a "no dig" technology and will have a reduced impact on most properties. The joints in the sanitary sewer main will be pressure tested and all joints that fail the test will then be filled with a grout designed to seal the pipe joint. However, some of the sanitary sewers are located in side and back yards and the contractor, on occasion, will have to access this area.

The existing sewer main is located in the road right-of-way or in an easement. Unfortunately, some landscaping and/or bushes may need to be trimmed or removed to access sanitary sewer appurtenances. The contractor will restore any damage to the yards. Any landscaping, bushes, trees, irrigation systems, etc., within the easement or right-of-way are subject to removal and not be replaced. Our contractor will attempt to protect these items if possible.

The contractor, Edward Kelly & Sons, Inc., will be performing the work on behalf of the District. Construction has started and will continue through the summer of 2018.

The District will have an inspector on-site to address any issues or concerns. However, if you have questions or need additional information, please call me at (419) 354-9090, ext. 130. The District will try to accommodate all requests and do everything it can to minimize any disturbance that this project may cause.
