WATER TALKS

The District participated in the January 31, 2018 public signing of the Toledo Regional Water Authority (TAWA) Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) document.

Although there may not be complete agreement, each party is working with a March 15th deadline to decide on proceeding into an agreement to form TAWA. This includes funding planning costs estimated at over \$5 million dollars.

The District held an informational meeting on February 15th that reviewed the TAWA MOU and a county-wide alternative water study.

The alternative water study was funded by the Wood County Economic Development Commission.

The District's Board of Trustees will have to make a decision to either join TAWA or seek another alternative. Go to NWWSD.org for the latest information.

CUSTOMER CARE

The District has determined that a large percentage of storm water enters into the sanitary system through private sewer lines. During heavy rainfall events, this can create basement flooding, sewer overflows to area streams and excess flow to the wastewater plant.

The District has created a grant program to assist customers with the removal of storm water from their private sewer system.

Grants will be available for 50% of the cost of the sanitary laterals that are related to the reduction of storm water from the sewer system with a maximum grant of \$3,000

CONSTRUCTION CORNER

MCCOMB - WATERLINE IMPROVEMENTS

Through May, lane restrictions are possible on Todd, Scott, South and High Streets for waterline replacement.

MILLBURY- SEWER WORK

Through June, lane restrictions are possible in Millbury for sewer work and manhole repairs.

PERRYSBURG TOWNSHIP-THE HAMLET SUBDIVISION

Through September, lane restrictions are possible in the Hamlet subdivision for waterline replacement.

PERRYSBURG TOWNSHIP- SANITARY SEWER REPAIR

Through July, lane restrictions are possible in Perrysburg Township for sewer repair.

WESTON - WATERLINE PROJECT

Through June, lane restrictions are possible along Silver Street in Weston for waterline installation. Lane restrictions are also possible on Main Street for pump station repair.

Through GIS analysis, The District found additional improvements were going to be necessary soon, and added that work to the project. This saves time, money, and means less disruption to service and daily commutes.

CUSTOMER CARE (CONTINUED)

Grants are available to owner occupied homes. In order to qualify, the homeowner must hire a plumber to perform a video inspection that can be reviewed by The District. The plumber should also provide a quote for the proposed repair services. If it is determined that the proposed repair meets our requirements, then you may proceed with the work. This is a great way to take care of lingering sewer problems, with part of the cost covered by The District! Some problems that may be covered are root intrusion, sump pump problems, broken sewer laterals and leaking joints. This work will benefit you as a customer with a better private sewer system, as well as all of the residents of northwest Ohio through removal of pollution from the environment and reduced sewer surcharging.
